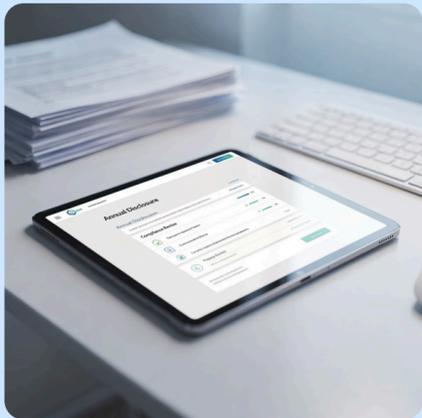


RCC Quarterly Meeting Summary

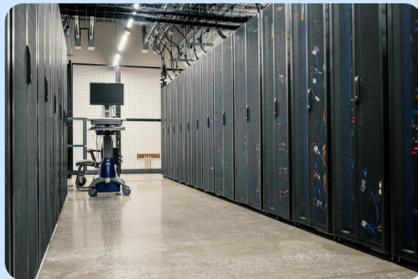
✓ **Strong turnout fosters collaboration:** 51 RCC members and 45 community participants.

Conflict of Interest (COI): Annual Disclosure

Quinton Johnson provided an update on the transition to an annual COI disclosure model planned for this quarter, which will streamline requirements and reduce administrative burden. Additional details are available on the [COI Annual Disclosure Transition webpage](#).



DOJ Bulk Data Rule

Quinton Johnson reviewed the implications of the DOJ Bulk Data Rule for data sharing with countries of concern and emphasized the importance of early consultation for projects involving sensitive data.
